Club member plant purchases will happen on Friday from 3 to 6 p.m. and after 10 a.m., Saturday. Lorene will be the point person.


Wear your bright green shirts to the sale so members are easily identified to the public. We will break down the sale prior to having lunch. Many hands will make the process go by quickly.

I have one last favorite garden tool to share with you – long handle Dutch Garden Hoe. I bought mine at the Smith and Hawken Store in Hingham when they were going out of business. I had no idea what I was buying, but I knew I had to have it as it was half price! It turned out to be my favorite



"go to" tool in the shed. After much research, I learned that it can be ordered on-line at my favorite store – Home Depot and delivered to you or to your local store. Here is the link:

This garden tool is very versatile. I use it for weeding, edging, scraping dry soil and reseeding. I especially like that it is light weight and has an extra long handle. My

bad back especially likes this tool as it is great for weeding the garden without having to bend over! The end of the tool is stainless steel which is great for maintenance (little or no rust). My Dutch Garden Hoe is made in England and the handle is made of ash – excellent quality!



With all the tools I own, my two favorite are the Spear Head Spade Shovel and this Dutch Garden Hoe. Now I wish I just had the time to utilize them more often!
