January Horticulture Spotlight I assume everyone in the group has some house plants. While heating the indoors this winter it's important to water our house plants, especially those in clay pots. The soil in clay pots dries out more quickly. Misting them with a spray bottle a couple of time a week is a good idea too, they love the bath.

> Let's talk of the love mealybugs and aphids have for our house plants. If plants are over watered it is easy for mealybugs to form. Their appearance as tiny white balls on the plant causes the plant to yellow. Remedy this by dapping bugs with a Q Tip dipped in rubbing alcohol. This will kill them naturally. Should they redevelop apply the treatment a second time.

> Aphids are green and often found on the underside of the plant leaves. My suggestion is to arm yourself with a one quart spray bottle and Dawn dishwashing liquid. Step one is to fill the the bottle nearly to the top. To the water add ten drops of dishwashing liquid, cover tightly and shake well. Best time to liberaly apply this spray to the underside of the leaves is early morning or evening. The benefit of applying the spray during these times is that the spray remains on the bugs longer before disappearing. If successful, the bugs will turn brown and then black indicating they've been destroyed. Apply the process again a few days later to ensure the babies have been killed off as well.
